 We use I will or I'll, and I will not or I won't. We usually use the short forms. (I'll, he'll, I won't, he won't) when we speak.



2. We use **will** to talk about future facts, and things that we think will happen in the future:

My father will be fifty years old tomorrow. Jane will love your new dress. He's a good manager. He won't make any mistakes.

We also use will to ask about the future: *Will they win this game?*

 We use I'll when we make a decision to do something. For example, when the telephone rings, we say: I'll answer it.

Here is another example:

- A: Does anyone want to come with me tonight?
- B: Yes, I'll come.
